Senior Review of Student Portfolio

Note: In some cases, Mission of the Church courses and Evangelism courses may simultaneously count for limited electives. It is acceptable to have a course simultaneously count for an UMC ordination requirement and a graduate requirement for Duke Divinity. UMC students are encouraged to check with Conference administrators about which courses will count for UMC ordination requirements.

Student Portfolio

MDiv students are required to compile and submit a Student Portfolio for review by a faculty member. The reviews will normally happen in the first semester of the student's Middler year, and in the final semester of the Senior year. The contents of the portfolio and timing of the evaluations are described in the Academics section on the Divinity website.

Timely completion of the portfolio reviews is required to continue in the M.Div. degree program and for conferral of the M.Div. degree.
