Writing Assessment

Students are required to complete a writing assessment at the start of their first semester. This assessment is evaluated by am instructor, who then meet with students to provide feedback on the students' strengths and weaknesses, to explain the types of theological writing they will be expected to master for their classes, and to acquaint them with the services of the Writing Center.

Student Portfolio

M.T.S. students are required to compile and submit a Student Portfolio for review by a faculty member. The review is due in the final semester of the senior year. Timely completion of the portfolio reviews is required to continue in the M.T.S. degree program and for conferral of the M.T.S. degree.

Pass/Fail Grading

Students are limited to no more than 25 percent of a student's total curriculum at Duke to be graded as pass/fail.
