Basic Degree Requirements:

- Maintenance of 2.0 GPA; 18 credits: 6 units of Spiritual Formation, 6 core courses, 6 electives
- Writing Assessment: Students are required to complete a writing assessment at the start of
 their first semester. This assessment is evaluated by an instructor, who then meets with the
 student to provide feedback on their work, explain the types of theological writing they will be
 expected to master for their classes, and acquaint them with the services of the Center for
 Writing and Academic Support.



Master of Arts (in Christian Practice) Curricular Paradigm Foundations (Track 1)

- **Student Portfolio:** M.A. students are required to compile and submit a Student Portfolio for review by an academic advisor or instructor. The review is due at the end of the fifth term.
- Pass/Fail Grading: Students may request up to three courses as P/F beyond the Christian Practice 701 courses.
- Transfer Credit: Students are limited to no more than 2 approved non-DIV courses.

*Students in Terms 2 and 4 must take an additional core course, either New Testament 707 or Old Testament 706 and either Church History 708 or Christian Theology 705.

Students graduate and degrees are conferred in September after Term 6. Commencement activities only occur in May. Students are invited to return to campus to participate in Commencement in the first May after their degree is conferred. For most students, this will be approximately 9 months after students receive their diploma.
