

Sources and Abbreviations for Charles Wesley's Preaching Register

Primary Records for Charles Wesley's Preaching

CW letter	The specific manuscript letter by Charles Wesley will be indicated in a footnote, as well as its holding location.
CW notation	Notes that Wesley made on his early manuscript sermons indicating when and where he preached the sermon.
Journal letter	In the early years of the revival in particular, John and Charles Wesley kept each other informed of developments in their separate preaching tours through letters detailing their travels, preaching, etc. Some of Charles's letters to his family also fit in this category. The specific journal letter will be indicated in a footnote, as well as its holding location.
